

Where is Puerto Williams located?

Puerto Williams is the southernmost village in the world, located 48 km east-southeast of Ushuaia, on Navarino Island, on the southern Chilean shore of the Beagle Channel. It is a very picturesque village, where horses live freely. The boat will be moored alongside the Micalvi (former stranded cargo ship serving as a nautical club and pontoon for sailboats).

But why a cruise departure from Puerto Williams instead of Ushuaia? Because this saves us tedious administrative formalities for the boat and its passengers, thus saving us two days on your cruise program. Indeed, leaving Ushuaia would involve leaving Argentina (immigration, naval headquarters, customs), before reaching Puerto Williams in four hours of navigation and this time completing entry formalities into Chile (immigration, navy, customs and phytosanitary authority), which would be repeated on the return to Ushuaia. In addition, the port authorities of Puerto Williams do not let us go to sea above 35 knots of established wind, which could compromise your plane tickets for your return. So you'll be able to fully enjoy your vacation, without the administrative hassle.

To reach us in Puerto Williams, the easiest way is by plane from Punta Arenas with DAP (www.dap.cl) from Monday to Saturday (connection from Santiago de Chile several times a day) for a price of around 110 euros for the outward journey, the same for the return journey.

On board you will be a full-fledged crew member and will participate fully in the boat's maneuvers and life on board. This also includes household chores (meals, dishes, cleaning, etc., from which the captain is exempt), as well as good humor! If you wish to benefit from the services of a hostess cook on board, this involves an additional cost of 120 euros/day to be shared between all passengers; in this case you will just have to put your feet under the table.
