







Day 2 Departure from Puerto Toro for Lennox Island and anchorage for the night.

Departure from Lennox island and sailing towards the archipelago Wollaston, with anchorage for the night in caleta Maxwell on Hermite Island.

Departure from Maxwell Cove for the passage of Cape Horn and anchoring to spend the night in Caleta Martial on Herschel Island.

Departure from Caleta Martial to return to Puerto Toro and anchoring for the night.

Departure from Puerto Toro to Puerto Williams (procedures) and on the way to Caleta Borracho in the Beagle Channel, to spend the night.

Barbecue on the beach and then departure to Caleta Olla in the northwest arm.




Day 8
